It's felt a bit like January this last week.... a bit cold in the evening but perfect for curling up on the sofa with a glass of wine. The rain filling up our reservoirs is so very welcome!

I have decided to donate another painting from my "Colheita" series of 12 paintings ....the Portuguese word for grape harvest.

Each painting in the series represents a different lberian grape variety and my March painting is called **Aragonez**, which is a grape that originated in Spain but, since the late 19th century is also grown in Portugal.

This grape is used to produce some fine Iberian red wines and is also an ingredient in the best vintage Port wines. I've tried to capture the grape's aromas.... ripe berries and a strong tannin, symbolised by the colour green.

As to the technique, some of you might have noticed that I've taken some inspiration from Gerhard Richter's squeegee paintings. I am sure he would not mind.

There is no need for a frame, because the edges are painted black but the photo provides an idea of how the painting would look framed, over a small furniture piece.
